We are pleased to welcome Dr White back to the practice in June. Dr White previously worked here as a trainee, but will be returning as a GP Partner.



Changes to Diabetic Reviews

Here at the practice, we are constantly reviewing our processes to try and increase both efficiency and increase convenience for patients and clinicians alike.

With this in mind, we are changing the way in which we conduct our diabetic reviews. This is in part due to the fact that currently there is quite a high rate of non-attendance at diabetic reviews, which wastes 30 minutes of nurse appointments. When people do have an appointment, sometimes they have not got all of the necessary tests they need.

The change in process is as follows:

- When your diabetic review is due, you will receive a text or a phone call informing you that your blood forms and the urine pot for the urine test are ready for collection at the surgery. We will also text or phone you to ask for some information including an up-to-date blood pressure reading and your weight.
- Once the blood tests, the urine test and the weight and blood pressure information are all collected, we will then book a review with a clinician for you. I am afraid that we are not able to book reviews until the necessary tests and measurements are in.

I hope this change in practice improves both efficiency for the practice as well as convenience for our diabetic patients. If you do have any feedback on the process, please do let us know on the comments section of our website.
